The Norwegian Maritime Authority (the NMA) acknowledges and thanks Witherby Publishing Group (Witherbys) for its interest in, inter alia, the Norwegian legislation applicable to ships registered in a Norwegian ship register.

In accordance with MSC-MEPC.2/Circ.2, nautical publications may be carried on board ships in electronic form. Any publications for emergency use including first aid publications, shall be readily available independent of any computers. The International Code of Signals and the International Aeronautical and Maritime Search and Rescue (IAMSAR) Manual shall be available in hard copies.

Regulations and other statutory instruments adopted by the NMA are available free of charge for downloading from the internet both in the Norwegian ((<https://lovdata.no/> or <https://www.sdir.no/sjofart/regelverk/>)) and English languages (<https://www.sdir.no/en/shipping/legislation/>).

A ship owner may choose among different suppliers of relevant nautical information. Provided the integrity of public domain information is secure and maintained secure, Witherbys is free to download, package, reproduce and distribute information from the sources mentioned above.

The NMA offers an internet service in which Witherbys may subscribe and be notified of news, new legislation, amendments to current legislation as well as the adoption of circulars and safety notices as applicable (<https://www.sdir.no/en/news/news-from-the-nma/>).
